

The Graduate Certificate of Regulation and Governance (CREGO) is a unique graduate certificate program that aims to help professionals and organisations to understand and better navigate an environment where new forms of complexity, risk and technology are significantly increasing challenges for regulators.

Why choose this degree?

This program prepares students to understand and apply key Australian and international ideas and approaches to effective regulation. It draws on the evidence-based research and the 'big ideas' in regulation for which RegNet is world famous and has been designed in collaboration with Access Canberra, the peak regulatory organisation in the Australian Capital Territory.

Career paths

This graduate certificate is for people who are currently managing regulatory portfolios and projects in government agencies - or who will do so in future. It also supports professionals who work with regulatory stakeholders, including business and industry, Territory, State and Federal government agencies, the legislature, community actors and the media.

The program uses case studies, hands-on assessments and recognised examples of regulatory excellence from Australia, Europe, North America and Asia and the Pacific.

It has a collaborative learning environment that draws on regulatory scholarship as well as the experience of different regulatory actors and course participants.

Admissions

Entry requirements

A Bachelor degree or international equivalent is required. Minimum GPA 4/7.

All applicants must meet the University's English language admission requirements for students.

Admission to most ANU programs is on a competitive basis.

Applicants who do not hold a bachelor degree or an international equivalent with a minimum GPA of 4/7 may apply to admission based on:

(a) a minimum of 5 years' work experience in a role that has responsibility for organisation-level or public, private or NGO sector-wide regulatory system design and/or monitoring and compliance and/or enforcement (an employer statement of service and evidence of the work experience will be required); or

(b) a minimum of 10 years' work experience in one or more roles at ANZSCO Skill Level 1. These roles need not relate directly to regulation and/or governance. Most occupations at ANZSCO Skill Level 1 have a level of skill commensurate with a bachelor degree or higher qualification. At least five years of relevant experience may substitute for the formal qualification. In some instances relevant experience and/or

on-the-job training may be required in addition to the formal qualification (ANZSCO Skill Level 1).

In line with the university's admissions policy and strategic plan, an assessment for admission may include competitively ranking applicants on the basis of specific academic achievement, English language proficiency and diversity factors.

Skills

Students will be able to identify and define core ideas in contemporary regulation and compliance and understand, at a more advanced level, the theories and evidence that inform regulatory practice. They will be able to develop and test new approaches to regulation and compliance suited for particular problems and contexts and develop and present regulatory policy proposals.

Students will also be able to analyse the role and influence of a diverse range of regulatory actors and interpret selected Australian and international case studies and apply these insights to everyday regulatory challenges in your workplace.

Everyone in the program has the opportunity to undertake training in quantitative and qualitative research techniques and data analysis customised for professional, evidence-based approaches to regulation and governance.
